

Questions asked on the Guion Miller Roll Application

The original *Eastern Cherokee Applications of the U.S. Court of Claims*, 1906–1909, commonly called the "Miller Roll Applications" have been microfilmed by the National Archives (M 1104, 348 rolls).

Once an ancestor is found in one of the many indexes to the Miller Roll Applications, it is very important for researchers to review all applications (accepted or rejected) of their direct and collateral ancestors—although similar, varied information is often revealed.

This file offers viewers the opportunity to see the questions that claimants were required to fill out when they applied for the financial reward.
